



## Armstrong Family Letter Collection (KSCOLL 14)

The KCK Letter Collection comprises correspondence of the Ben and Rebecca Armstrong family of Argentine, Kansas during the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

### Collection Description

This collection includes correspondence of the Benjamin Armstrong family of Argentine, Kansas, and a few miscellaneous family documents.

### **Historical Note:**

Benjamin Jeremiah Armstrong, son of Archibald and Mary Elizabeth (Brown) Armstrong, was born in Indiana February 4, 1847. He married Rebecca Tislow of Duff, Indiana. They had five sons and three daughters. Four children died in infancy.

In 1876 he started West with his wife, daughter, and brother George. George met and married Miss Missouri Organ in St. Louis. The brothers joined a building crew, working up the Missouri and Kansas Rivers to Rossville. In 1879, the two families came east to the Argentine-Rosedale hills. George soon left for the lead mines in Southern Missouri. Benjamin worked at the Argentine

smelter. After it closed, he started building houses in the West end of Argentine. In 1912, he moved to a farm near Edgerton, Kansas, but soon returned to Argentine to build houses.

Rebecca Armstrong taught Sunday School in the Dunkard church on Powell until her death in 1905.

In 1907 he married Mrs. Frances (Ashren) Armstrong and raised her son, William Norris Armstrong.

As a member of the G. A. R., he took part in Memorial Day services at Maple Hill Cemetery. He is buried in the Soldiers' Circle there, the last surviving member of the G. A. R. in Argentine. In 1935 he was invited to join the Argentine VFW Post as an honorary member. He died later that same year at the age of 88. He was a familiar figure on Strong Avenue, walking to the Post Office every day. His white, flowing beard endeared him to the children, who called him Santa Claus.
